Minutes for March 13, 2003 meeting

Ben Bailey gave an excellent demonstration of replacing MGB rear drum brakes with disc brakes.

Parts needed

'85 Saab 900 rotor and caliper
3/8 fine thread bolts (a little longer than the existing bolts-Ben used #9 bolts rather than the standard #8)

Proportioning valve

Second set of Saab calipers

Harley master cylinder

Custom 3/8" thick steel plates



First Ben removed the old drum brakes and replaced them with the Saab rotor. The rotors had been drilled to accept the two screws that hold a MGB drum in place.

Ben had custom 3/8" thick steel plates manufactured, drilled and tapped to fasten to the boltholes to which the back of the drum would normally fit. (We hope to post a scale drawing of this bracket) The brackets were bolted on and the calipers bolted to the bracket.



The new calipers will accept the MGB brake line, so hookup is easy. A proportioning valve will need to be put in place to make sure the rear drums don't overpower the front. Such a valve can be found at some auto parts stores and at race shops.

Ben also placed an additional set of calipers on the other side of the rotor to use as a parking brake. He plans to install a small Harley-Davidson master cylinder to operate the parking brake, though other options are available.

Tech Tip!

Our Tech Tip this week is from Bob Ward.

I have rebuilt several sets of SU carburetors and after stumbling around trying to mount, rebuild and remount them I discovered a hand solution.

If you have the manifold off the engine, it can be bolted to a piece of wood. Or mount the carbs directly to a piece of wood. The alignment will be tricky without the manifold. The wood piece can then be clamped in a vice. The carbs can be mounted to the manifold so you can work on the linkages. Once the Linkages are set and adjusted, another single piece of wood is drilled to fit the Air Cleaner holes on the intake side. By bolting this piece of wood to the carbs, then removing them from the manifold, or the first piece of wood, it is then easy to transfer the carbs and linkages to the manifold. Tighten the carbs, and then remove the bolts holding the second wood piece.

I keep the filter piece of wood in the A s tool bag, and if I ever need to remove the carbs, I simply bolt the wood on, and unbolt the carbs
